Population Served:	Primarily, kindergarten to grade 6 students as well as their parents/caregivers. However, occasionally we also have toddlers or infants and their caregivers join us.

	You are invited and most welcome to come to the coffee hour immediately after the 10:30 am service and/or to come to any of the social activities that St. James offers periodically (for

example, Soup & Bread lunches on select Sundays, Soup-to-Go events and Student Dinners during exams for post-secondary students. St. James also warmly welcomes you to participate in any of our other worship services, bible studies or other activities. However, interns will not be paid for these social times or any time they choose to spend at other parish programs or activities which aren't required for their work.

- From time to time, as determined by the Children & Youth Ministries Coordinator in consultation with the Lead Teacher, interns may also be scheduled to work at special children's ministry or intergenerational events that are held on weekends, PA days or weekday evenings. Interns will be paid for their hours spent preparing for and working at such occasional programs and should record these hours on their monthly time sheet along with their regular Sunday hours.
- The intern will also be compensated for additional time spent attending required Children's Ministry Team meetings; team building and/or spiritual development meetings with other interns; and/or required training.
- The Children & Youth Ministries
   Coordinator is responsible for scheduling
   interns and adult volunteer teachers and
   assistants for the Children's Church
   Sunday morning program.
- Interns will not be required to work on Thanksgiving Weekend, during the Christmas break, during Queen's December and April exam periods or Queen's fall and winter term reading weeks. However, if interns are in Kingston during these periods and would

- like to work (for example, between exams or on Sundays before or immediately following reading week before classes resume, they should inform the *Children & Youth Ministries Coordinator* so that she can factor their availability in when setting up the roster.
- If for any unexpected reason (e.g. illness, snowstorm, cancelled return flight, etc.) an intern realizes on short notice that they won't be able to make the shift they are scheduled for, they must contact the Lead Teacher immediately (or if the Lead Teacher is away or unreachable, the Children & Youth Ministries Coordinator instead).
- From time to time due to academic or serious conflicts an intern may wish to change the date on which they are scheduled. In this case, they should contact the C&Y Coordinator to request a scheduling change for the date that they have a conflict with. Such requests should be made as far in advance as is possible given the circumstances. If permission for the change is given, the intern may need to make their own arrangements to trade dates with another intern or adult volunteer teacher and inform the C&Y Coordinator who will be covering their shift. Academic or serious conflicts may include a mid-term or exam scheduled close to their shift; participation in an academic conference or forum, training or special family event like a wedding, etc.).
- If interns are performing their duties well and make mutually agreed upon arrangements in advance, they may request up to 1 Sunday off per month (not including the exam periods).
- Normally, the preparation time needed by interns to deliver the Children's Church program on Sunday morning or

	for any additional work that may be assigned to them can be scheduled by them in keeping with their school and other commitments. However, If the interns are working on a task or project which necessitates them being on site at St. James Anglican Church or another church setting, whenever possible these in-person hours will be scheduled on a day when either the Children and Youth Ministry Coordinator, a church staff member, or another intern is also able to be present.
Supervision & Support	Interns report to the Rev. Lisa Chisholm-Smith (St. James' Children & Youth Ministries Coordinator) for all contract, payroll, scheduling and human resources issues and requirements: including a final debrief and feedback meeting near the end of the winter term. Both the Children and Youth Ministries Coordinator and the Lead Teacher help to orient the intern(s) at the beginning of their deployment.
	Deacon <b>Lisa Chisholm-Smith</b> is a part-time staff person and ordained minister who also serves as the Anglican Chaplain at Queen's (out of an office at St. James).
	Interns will report to the <i>Lead Teacher</i> <b>Jennifer Jones</b> re: issues related to specific Sunday morning sessions, curriculum, and classroom management questions.
	Jennifer Jones is an experienced Sunday School teacher, recently retired public-school teacher, and church volunteer. Most Sundays, she will also be teaching one of the <i>Children's Church</i> classes and so will be available to consult with and problem solve on the spot, as needed. However, she does get one Sunday off per month so in her absence, interns will report to a designated teacher (or C&Y Coordinator) for that week.

	Lisa Chisholm-Smith (St. James' Children and Youth Ministry coordinator) is also normally on site at St. James on Sunday mornings and fills in as a Children's Church teacher or class assistant when needed. However, she serves as deacon in the 10:30 a.m. service 1-2 times per month and has other Sunday responsibilities as Anglican Chaplain at Queen's and Campus Minister. So, if you would like to meet with her, it is best to set up a mutually convenient time to meet either on Sunday after the 10:30 a.m. service or during the week.
